HONORIFIC AWARD NOMINATIONS Ernest Beutler Lecture and Prize

Named for the late Dr. Ernest Beutler, past president of ASH and a physician-scientist for more than 50 years, this two-part award and lectureship is intended to recognize major translational advances related to a single topic, typically a disease or group of diseases. ASH presents this award to two individuals, one recognized for enabling advances in basic science, and the other recognized for achievements in clinical science and translational research.

Awardees give back-to-back plenary lectures during the ASH annual meeting. Closely connected lecture pairings that explain how achievements in clinical science or translational research were used to carry specific basic science advances through to tangible improvements in patient care are highly desirable. Such connected basic and clinical or translational contributions celebrate inspiring examples of advances in hematology, as exemplified by Dr. Beutler's own contributions to the field. Nominations for less closely connected basic and clinical contributions are also encouraged, provided that they both pertain to the same topic.

Nominations must describe a lecture topic and identify 1) the enabling advances in basic science and 2) the clinical science and translational research related to the topic. Nominations must identify at least one individual who could be recognized for enabling advances in basic science and at least one other individual who could be recognized for achievements in clinical science and translational research. The completed nomination form and a letter of nomination should summarize the basic and clinical contributions related to the topic, and the respective roles of the individuals nominated for the award. Multiple names for each lecture may be submitted for consideration by the Awards Committee.

Nominations for ASH Honorific Awards are accepted throughout the year. Any nomination submitted before the award deadline will be considered for the current review cycle. Nominations submitted after the award deadline will be considered for the subsequent review cycle.

NOTE: Nominees and nominators are not required to be members of ASH.
