HONORIFIC AWARD NOMINATIONS

E. Donnell Thomas Lecture and Prize

Named for E. Donnell Thomas, Nobel Prize laureate and past president of ASH, this lectureship, created in 1992, is intended to recognize pioneering research achievements in hematology that have represented a paradigm shift or significant discovery in the field.

Nominations must include the completed nomination form and a letter of nomination summarizing the nominee's contributions to hematology, including the reason for the nomination. In addition, a copy of the nominee's current CV and NIH biosketch, annotated with "Contributions to Science," if available, must be submitted with the nomination form.

Nominations for the ASH Honorific Awards are accepted throughout the year. Any nomination submitted prior to the award deadline will be considered for the current review cycle. Nominations submitted after the award deadline will be considered for the subsequent review cycle.

NOTE: Nominees and nominator must be members of ASH.
